Hearnshaw's 10 principles of conservatism

1. Reverence for the past:

- societies accumulate wisdom from their customs and traditions
- they respect the accomplishments of their ancestors

2. Organic conception of society:

- society is greater than the sum of their parts
- take on a communal identity and unity

3. Constitutional continuity

- o constitutions are indissoluble
- o carry the proven political norms and practices of the past to the present

4. Opposition to revolution

reject radical change because it destroys proven customs and institutions

♦ 5. Cautious reform

change should be evolutionary and carefully deliberated

♦ 6. Religious basis of the state

 state has a moral, religious and sacred character beyond the political and legal personality

⋄ 7. Divine source of legitimate authority

opolitical and legal authority is divine in its authority

♦ 8. Priorities of duties to rights

- individuals have civic duties as well as personal rights
- people are obligated to fulfill them in the interest of the entire community (body politic)

♦ 9. Loyalty

♦ to family, church, school, party, institutions and country

○ 10. Common sense and pragmatism

- opractical action rather than theory
- devoted to sound administration rather than prolific legislation
